Happy, Healthy Chickens at the Farm

As a caretaker of our feathered friends here at the farm, I'm often asked what it takes to keep a large flock thriving and content. While fresh food and water are the baseline, true chicken wellness comes down to satisfying their natural instincts. One of the most vital routines for a chicken is dust bathing. It might look like they are just playing in the dirt, but coating their feathers in fine soil or sand is actually how they keep themselves clean, absorbing excess oils and naturally deterring pests like mites.

While our chickens always have access to their standard feeders for their main meals, we love to provide extra enrichment by scattering special feed and treats in the coop and in the yard.. In the wild, birds spend the majority of their day scratching the ground, so this extra activity encourages their natural drive to forage, keeping them active and entertained. We also like to put treats in little containers that we have drilled holes in. They actually kick them around and get the seed out. Volunteer Denise, brings scratch and fresh veggies several times a week!

Of course, none of this works without a clean, safe foundation. Maintaining a clean coop and run is essential for preventing respiratory issues and keeping the flock healthy. By balancing a clean habitat with plenty of opportunities to scratch, dust bathe, and explore, we ensure our chickens live their absolute best lives here at the farm!
