This time, there was no cure. We worked closely with his doctor to make sure he stayed comfortable and happy. Even in his last weeks, Frankie showed how strong and special he was. Though he was getting weaker, he still had little bursts of energy—greeting us at the gate for his walks, and checking the yard like it was his job. On his last day, Frankie had a nice breakfast and a short walk with his favorite walker, Page. That evening, he rested on his favorite bed, surrounded by love. Just before midnight, Frankie passed away peacefully. Frankie was strong, gentle, and always watching over us. We will miss him so much, and remember him with love always.
